Sunday School Lessons Unit Two "Wisdom in the Gospels" July 2020

<u>Unifying Principle</u>

Some young people amaze us with a wisdom that seems beyond their years. How should we respond to precocious wisdnm? Ecclesiastes affirms that there is a time to speak and a time to be auiet, and Luke records that the teachers in the Temple were awed by the wisdom of twelve-year-old Jesus, but Mary and Joseph were confused and exasperated.

Goals for the Learners

- ✓ To explore the account of Jesus' experience in the Temple at the age of twelve.
- ✓ To sense the awe experienced by all those who witnessed Jesus' precocious wisdom as well as the angst experienced by Mary and Joseph.
- ✓ To rejoice in the opportunity to know the wisdom of God through Jesus.

Challenges for the Week

- Think of and name some precocious children and youth and how do you see the church receiving them and providing for their development in church and society?
- How do you think Jesus' childhood looked?
 What he treated like other children of his time?
- How do children growing up in the church show surprising spiritual insights and gifts and how do church leaders arrange for their special training and participation in church programs and activities to enhance their development?
- What is the place of children in the church based on the story of twelveyear-old Jesus?
- What is the inherent wisdom in asking good questions?
